2022 - in review

- Unfortunately, we will be experiencing massive utility rate increases in both the water & sewer.
 You will be informed as we receive more information from Clarksburg's Sanitary & Water
 boards. As you are aware, rates are required to be adjusted from time to time. Whenever
 Clarksburg does a rate increase on either water or sewer, satellite sites are also required to do
 a rate increase to be able to sustain their normal expenses as well as the new increases
 incurred through Clarksburg.
- Passed 7 ordinances
- The Fire Department obtained a Class 2 ISO rating
- The Police Department has successfully continued to maintain staffing & patrol patterns which deserves acknowledgment due to the shortage of law enforcement officers in our state.
- Improvement of street lighting throughout the city
- When we started focusing on the recycling program, the city was at 9% compliance. Citizens
 are recycling more than ever, improving to nearly 40 % compliance thanks to the new recycling
 bins. Let's hope this number continues to increase. I personally want to thank the citizens for a
 job well done and continue to help us make this program the best it can be.
- New garbage truck with the arm to lift the new trash cans for both recycling & solid waste to reduce excess trash in the neighborhoods & enhance sanitation for both employees & the public
- Our 2nd annual Christmas Tree Lighting & Parade on December 3rd @ 6:30 pm.
- The Cities 75th Anniversary celebration was a huge success.
- The Park Board along with assistance from our public works department made major upgrades to the Sammy C. Guzzo park (Third Street)

From the Public Works Department

It's wintertime again. Here are a few tips to help prepare you for winter. Protect indoor pipes with pipe insulation under sinks, attics, crawl spaces and along exterior walls.

Insulate attic and crawl spaces; keeping heat out of the attic may prevent damaging ice dams from forming on your roof.

Have your furnace and chimney checked by professionals to get the best heat efficiency.

Check your windows, installing storm windows creates an insulating layer of air between your windows and the cold air outside.

Clean and inspect your gutters. Clogged gutters can cause water to back up and freeze once temperatures drop.

Repair patios and pavers. A loose patio stone or paver will get worse over winter as the natural freeze and thaw creates a trip and fall hazard.

Check your trees for ailing limbs. A dead branch covered in snow can easily snap endangering your loved ones.

Secure outdoor water sources. Drain and store your garden hose or sprinklers. Shut off the water supply valve inside your house that feeds the line the open the outdoor spigot so trapped water inside can drain out. If you simply shut off the spigot itself, water trapped inside can freeze and cause a burst pipe inside.

Mark paths and driveways. After a heavy snowfall, it can be tough to see where driveways or walkways end, and your lawn begins. You can use fiberglass snow poles to line the edges of these areas to provide a clear path.

As the snow falls, please be patient. Public Works will salt/plow your street as soon as we can. Our priority is 1st, the Fire Department in case of an emergency; 2nd are the hills around the city; 3rd will be the main roads, 4th will be the alley's.

Winterize Your Vehicle

- Make sure your heater and defrosters are operational
- Check all lights and windshield wipers are operational
- During the winter season, be cautious of snow and icy roadways. Speed limits are
 posted for normal driving conditions. During inclement weather, driving at a slower
 speed is recommended

If you are going to deep fry a turkey by either gas or electric deep fryer, make sure the turkey is completely thawed out with no moisture. If you place a turkey in a deep fryer with moisture, you will get a grease explosion which could lead to a fire and/or possibly severe burns to you. Thaw and dry the turkey before you place it in that fryer and never leave it unattended. We wish your holidays to be memorable and for good reasons.

Keep your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors with new batteries and check them regularly.
